I would like to start this newsletter by telling you that it has been our honor and privilege to lead the reunions for the 579th Strategic Missile Squadron over the past several years. We followed the lead of Gene Lamb who with 7-8 others started this in Las Vegas in 1998. Our reunions have taken us from the east coast (Cocoa Beach, FL & the Kennedy Space Center) to the west coast (Pismo Beach & Vandenberg A.F.B.). Somehow we always wound up in Roswell and our home for several years in the early '60's, the 'wonderful' Walker Air Force Base. It was only fitting that our last official reunion be held at Walker.

Judy and I started to assemble the many 'parts' of this reunion about 6 months ago. (For those who don't know Judy is my wonderful bride of nearly 49 years, my accountant and keeper of the books, my proofreader, and my sounding board for ideas, etc. I must also acknowledge the late Les Hayles, who passed away earlier this year, a good friend and his lovely wife Dianna, Terry Doyle and Sandy, as well as Al Mauldin. Les, Terry and Al were instrumental in many of our reunions, from calling, emailing, field trips to planned location reunion sites, reunion photos, etc. I can't thank these people enough!!

Judy and I started our journey to Roswell on April 21st (3 weeks after her cervical spine surgery !) We spent a few days with my brother and sister-in-law in Pueblo, CO and drove to Albuquerque on April 26th then on to Roswell on the 27th. After meetings with the hotel management and the restaurant, (plus stocking the hospitality suite) we began to prepare for the registration to start the next morning (Thurs., 4/28). We spent most of the evening assembling the 'goody' bags with the key chains, dinner cards, ID cards, etc. and organized them for each of the attendees (in alphabetical order.) We finished this 'chore' by 3:00 AM !!! Several members had arrived early and helped us set up the registration table in the hotel lobby and was manned by Judy almost all day. During the day Hallie Kitchens stepped in as needed. By 5:00 PM most of the members had been registered, visited the hospitality suite and shortly after 6:00 PM we adjourned to the assigned banquet hall for a great meal of fajitas and enchiladas. After dinner, everyone either went to the hospitality suite or bed for the evening.

Friday morning many of us travelled to Site 4, owned by Gary Baker, who hosted us to a tour of the LCC and view of the silo. After lunch we visited the Air Terminal on base (site of the old flight op building and then toured the original hangar that was the MAMS building for the 579th SMS. A tour of the hangar was provided by the general manager of AerSale Company (current tenants) which refurbishes commercial jets. The evening was open for individual preferences for dinner.

Saturday morning began with a business meeting to discuss the plans for the future of reunions, the distribution of the remaining funds, and other requests such as reordering of the 579th SMS hats that several members had requested.
